Launched in 2013, Katha's
Search for Excellence in Creative
Writing helps students use their

and translations. Designed
to promote creative writing,
illustration and translation skills
in children 8–17 year old, the
programme has been designed
to nurture the creative instincts in

India's children and to give them a platform to share their writing and celebrate their work, thereby inspiring a generation of future writers.

After four successive hits, the fifth edition of the Katha's Search for Excellence in Creative Writing once again nurtured the latent writing skills in children by giving them a platform to share their writing and celebrate their creativity. In its fifth consecutive year, the programme took epic proportions with over 15,000 stories from over 600 participating schools from India and abroad.

This year too, eminent national and international writers, illustrators, educators, journalists, and innovators were invited to ment or India's budding young writersand illustrators. A series of engaging workshops were organized for children to expose them to literature from around the world and encourage them to think up ideas and explore them in their writing.

ON A CREATIVE TRAIL

Making Words Sing and Stories Dance!

In its fifth edition, the Search for Excellence with our partnering schools brought in excellent stories and poems from over 2700 students. We held Regional Writers' Workshops for the selected students in North, East, West and South zones in Oct–Nov 2017.

Through workshops on story writing, the programme helped students use their creativity and imagination to create their own stories. The trajectory of the programme is as follows:

SIEP 1:

Online submission of stories and poems. Participating schools organize the Search for Excellence in their respective schools. Selected stories are then submitted online to Katha at www.ilovereading.in.

SIEP 2:

A jury is formed by Katha to screen the online student submissions. The semi-finalists are selected for the four Regional Writers' Workshops in East, North, West and South zones. At the end of the regional workshops, students submit their entries for the final round.

SIEP 3:

Following the Regional Writers' Workshops, a team of resource people screen the submissions for Katha Utsav. The finalists, accompanied by their teachers or parents, participate in the workshops with national mentors and attend masterclasses with international writers and illustrators at the Katha National Utsav in New Delhi.






KATHA WRITERS' WORKSHOP




Atha Utsav's Regional Writers' Workshop commenced on 7th October 2017 at D.A.V School Vasant Kunj, marking the beginning of an exciting and creative journey. About 150 participants from North India gathered for the workshop, eagerly looked forward to learn the art of writing. The eclectic team of mentors which included Vikram Singh Rooprai, Rashmi Chaudhary, Gauri Chakraborty, Shiv Datt Sharma, Avani Parekh, Gunjan Gupta, Sangeeta Barooah Pisharoty and Sumedha Garg, was prepped up withits innovative plans for the day's proceedings.

They day began with a short introductory speech by Ms Geeta Dharmarajan, writer, editor, educator and Founder-President of Katha. Ms Dharmarajan spoke about the power of reading and writing through anecdotes from her own childhood, and motivated each child to tell their story in their own words, as each story is unique, and indisputably personal.

Then the gathering of students broke away to attend workshops with their respective mentors. While some workshops catered to younger children, quite a few of them involved of all ages.

All these sessions drew to a close in the afternoon, and all the students went back with their heads buzzing with ideas, and their hands itching to pen their stories!





The bestof student's stories from each school were nominated by student vote forKatha's Search for Excellence longlist. From this, a panel of respected national writers and illustrators choseyoung writers for the prestigious Katha Awards for Creative Writing.

The programme culminated into a grand finale in which 500 finalists come together in New Delhi. This three-day literary extra vaganza consisted of Writers' Workshops that included media & journalism sessions; poetry sessions; expressive arts & communication sessions; theatre, storytelling & heritage sessions. The sessions provided children with the tools to write creatively about practical ways to combat contemporary issues of environment, education, socio-economic disparity, while helping them broaden the spectrum of their imagination and understanding of the literary world and its many facets.



ALT21 - APPROACHES TO LANGUAGE TEACHING IN THE 21ST CENTURY

A freewheeling exchange between experimenting educators, parents and creators of children's books, the Approaches to Language Teaching in the 21st Century this year brought together an eclectic forum that discussed the importance of kindness and compassion in today's world.

Teachers and parents were invited to think, discuss, and share how they can cope in the new world to train and help children become empathetic beings. On 27 December 2018, Ms Apoorva Kamat, the founder of Karmantik anda Gandhi Fellow with an experience of working in the tribal belt of Rajasthan and a Young India Fellow, conducted workshop with parents and teachers on how to plan lessons using Katha books. The teachers and parents appreciated the interactive session as it allowed them to approach learning and lesson planning in innovative ways.

On Day 2, Mr Harriet Raghunathan, who's been teaching English literature in Jesus and Mary College, Delhi University, for the past 35 years, was invited to address parents and teachers across the country on Classroom Management and share with them the tips and strategies that work.

Parents and teachers spent the second half of the day with experts from Stones to Milestones who shared with them the importance of reading and how to bring simple yet effective changes in teaching methods.
