DO's

Places to See

Beaches: Marina Beach and Elliot's Beach

Archaeological Site: Plan a ONE day trip to Mamallapuram 50km to the south of Chennai

Temples: Sri Parthasarathy Temple built during the 8th Century, Kapaleeshwarar Temple and many more

Santhome Cathedral Basilica: Beautiful Neo-gothic architecture with a museum in the Church

Shopping: T. Nagar is the hub for stunning silk sarees, garments and gold jewellery

Food to Try

Dosas and Idlis: Try these South Indian breakfast staples with coconut chutney and sambar.

South Indian cuisine: Typical south Indian full meals served on plantain leaves

Filter Coffee: The iconic South Indian coffee is a must-try

What to Shop

Art: Tanjore paintings and bronze / brass sculptures

Fashion: The city is known for highquality traditional Kanchipuram Silk Sarees and Madras Cotton Fabric

Accessories: Explore the many handicraft stores and quaint outlets with handcrafted jewellery
